After Easter Sunday, Jesus spends forty days on earth with his disciples.

While he is blessing them, Jesus is taken up into Heaven, right before their eyes. They watch until he is hidden by a cloud. Two angels appear to tell them that Jesus will return in God's time. The disciples go back to Jerusalem to worship God and pray.

Now they have seen the Ascension of Jesus. Jesus has gone to Heaven to be with his Father God.

They know that Jesus is the Son of God. They know that Jesus is risen from the dead.

They know that Jesus is alive forever and will return in God's plan.

Now they will wait a little while in Jerusalem until the Holy Spirit comes to them. Then they will follow the Holy Spirit to spread the Good News of Jesus everywhere.
