



Week 6 – The Lord’s Prayer

Luke 11:1b (NIV)

“Lord, teach us to pray”

Both Luke Chapter 11 and Matthew Chapter 6 tell us that Jesus and his disciples have been together for a long time now. Jesus’ disciples have noticed that Jesus prays- a lot!- and that they don’t pray as often as Jesus does. Jesus seems to be talking with his Father God all the time.

Jesus has been teaching his followers about God’s Way of Living. Now they want to learn about God’s Way of Praying. So they ask Jesus to teach them.

Jesus shares a special prayer with them, a prayer that we call The Lord’s Prayer, because it was taught by the Lord Jesus.

This prayer includes Praise, Pardon, and Petition. When we say this special prayer, we start and end by Praising God, we ask for God’s Pardon (or forgiveness) and we Petition (that means we ask God for things that we need or want). These are important kinds of prayer.

Jesus tells his followers that they should keep praying, keep talking to God, no matter what.

We say The Lord’s Prayer like this:

“Our Father, who art in Heaven,
Hallowed be Thy name.
Thy kingdom come.
Thy will be done.
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those
who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom, and the power,
and the glory, forever and ever. “

And then we say “Amen”
