“Hosanna to the Son of David!”

Today Christians all over the world - grownups and children- are hearing the same story. It is the story we all remember on Palm Sunday.

The Palm Sunday story happens just a week before Good Friday and Easter. Jesus knows that he will be dying on earth soon, He knows that he needs to remind people who he is.
